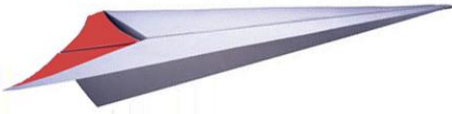
Airmen Certification Standards

- Helps in integrating aeronautical knowledge (“KNOW”), aeronautical decision-making (“CONSIDER”), and flight proficiency skill elements (“DO”) rather than rote memory of metrics in maneuvers.
- Assist in the formulation of “plans of actions (POA)” by having clear definitions of areas where the candidates failed in the knowledge test and by guiding applicants through a realistic, scenario-based experience.
- Does not change the time it takes to examine a candidate.



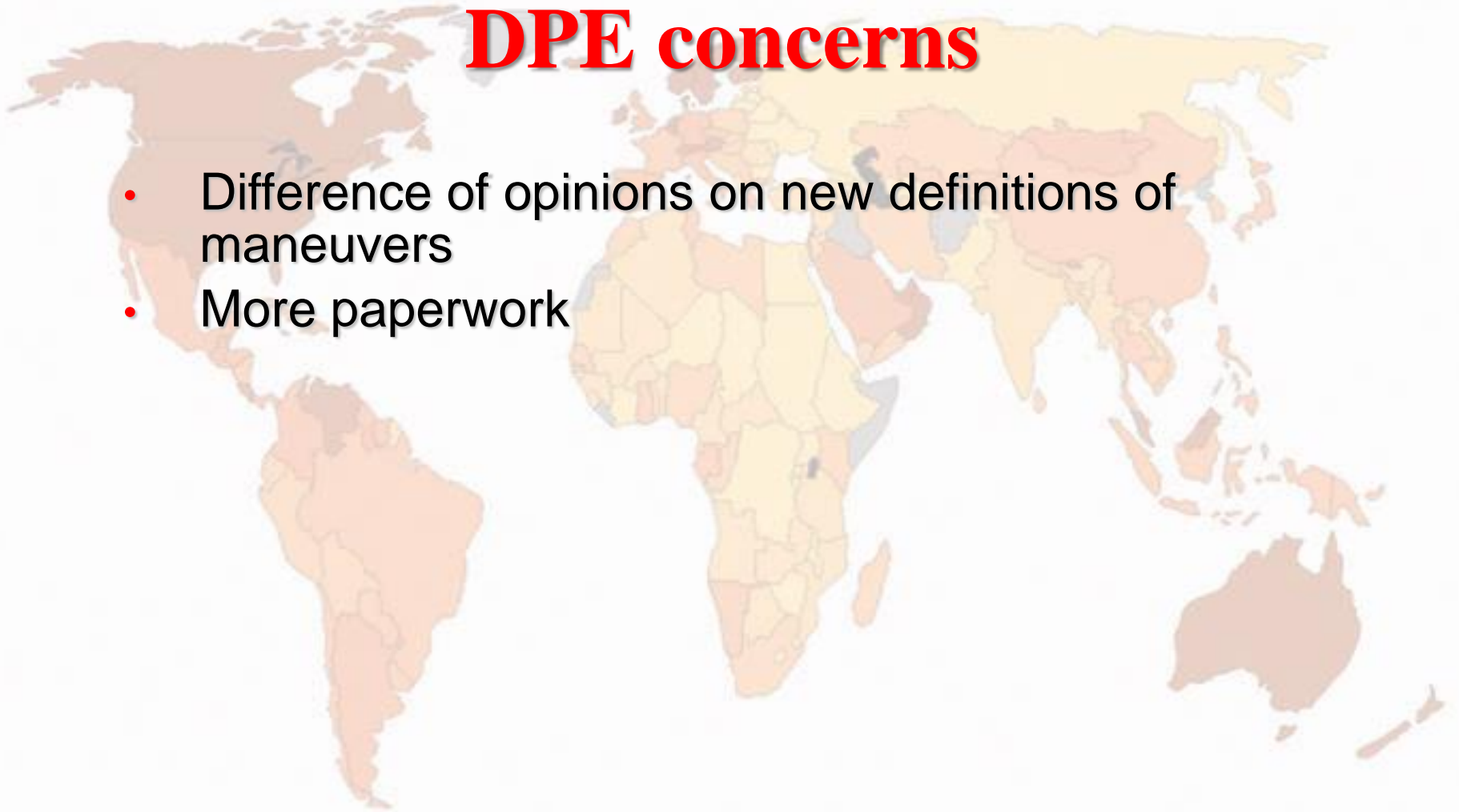
Airmen Certification Standards (continuation)

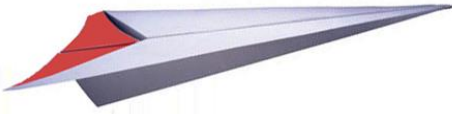
- It is easier for the DPE because everything is clearly written in the ACS and helps in the post practical test evaluation.
- ACS codifies what examiners have already been using in their plans of action over the last 10 years.
- Helps instructors to evaluate how prepared the candidates are for taking the practical test
- Assist instructors in certifying that candidates have demonstrated satisfactory knowledge of the subject areas in which the applicant was deficient on the airman knowledge test



DPE concerns

- Difference of opinions on new definitions of maneuvers
- More paperwork
