

Aviation Accreditation Board International February 23, 2024

SUMMARY OF RECENT ACTION

The Aviation Accreditation Board International (AABI) is required to inform the public about its accreditation decisions. One of the ways AABI does this is to provide the public with information about the accreditation decision process, the nature and scope of AABI accreditation activity and the importance and value of accreditation. AABI also provides the public with detailed descriptions of its accreditation policies and procedures by publishing its Accreditation Criteria Manual (Form 201) and Policies & Procedures Manual (Form 225), along with all the AABI forms, on its website: http://www.aabi.aero/forms.html (Standard 2.A., October 4, 2021, CHEA Standards and Procedures for Recognition).

Extension Request:

Florida Memoral University

The Board action was to grant the extension to the term of accreditation to February 28, 2025, subject to satisfactory completion by FMU of all the following requirements:

- 1. The Board extended the due date for submission of the Self-Study Report (SSR) in Weave to June 6, 2024, with the clear understanding that this will be the absolute latest date for submission to avoid lapse of the current accreditation.
- If the SSR is submitted by the due date and accepted by AABI, the Team Visit originally due during spring 2024 will be scheduled for fall 2024.
- 3. If the Team Visit is satisfactorily accomplished during fall 2024, the Board will consider reaffirmation of FMU's program at its meeting in February 2025.
- 4. If the Board acts to reaffirm the program accreditation at the February 2025 meeting, the effective date of reaffirmation will be July 31, 2024 (the original date), with the 5-year accreditation status on the original timeline.

Please be advised that if the SSR due date is not met, accreditation of FMU's Aviation Management program will expire July 31, 2024.
